Introduction

Govt. College Haripur, Tehsil Manali, District Kullu, Himachal Pradesh was established in the year 2006, vide notification No. EDN-11(8)-49-79/2006 of Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh, to cater to the needs of higher education of the students of Upper Kullu Valley locally known as 'Ujhi' Valley. The college building was inaugurated on October 20, 2013, by the then Chief Minister, Late Sh. Vir Bhadhra Singh, and was named 'Jawahar Lal Nehru Government College, Haripur (Manali).' Nestled in the heart of 'Barshai' Kothi, on the left bank of river 'Arjikiya' (Beas), this is one of the most beautiful colleges of Himachal Pradesh. GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO 1ST YEAR UNDERGRADUATE COURSES (B.A./B.SC./B.COM) SESSION 2025-26

Eligibility for Admission to 1st Year

A student who has cleared the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education (Or in case of Shastri, passed Prak Shastri from Sanskrit College affiliated to the HPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the H.P. University will be given admission strictly according to merit and reservation roster for various reserved categories of students as per the University Guidelines.

- (i) Provided that the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination, i.e, 10+2 with Science Stream shall be given admission to B.Sc.
- (ii) Provided that the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination, i.e. 10+2 with commerce stream shall be given preference to admission to B.Com.
- (iii) Any student with compartment in 10+2 examination will not be eligible for admission.
- (iv) An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age in case of boys and 25 years in case of girls on 01.07.2021. There is the relaxation of 3 years for SC/ST candidates as per University norms. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months for reasons to be recorded in writing.
- (v) One seat in each department shall be reserved for single girl child which will be allotted on the basis of merit.
- (vi) In each main core course of study there are 80 seats available.

Checklist of the Documents Required at the time of filling of Admission Forms

The **photo copies** of the following documents are required at the time of filling of **Admission Forms** for the 1st year:

- Two passport Size unattested Photographs. One to be pasted on the admission form and the other one on the identity-cum-library card and are required to be attested only by the college authorities.
- Self-Attested Copies of Matriculation and 10+2 Certificates

- Latest Character Certificate along with school leaving certificate from the institution last attended. In case of private candidates, latest character certificate by a H.P. Govt. Gazetted Class-I Officer or any other competent authority.
- Self-Attested Copies of category certificate (SC/ST/OBC/IRDP) if claimed.
- Self-Attested Copies of Sports/Cultural/NCC/NSS etc. if any (At 10+2 level)
- A certificate from the competent authority in case of Single Girl Child.
- Bonafide Himachali certificate for fee concession (for Girl students only).
- Aadhar Card
- Migration Certificate required for the students who have passed 10+2 exam from states other than Himachal Pradesh.

General Guidelines for Admission to Bachelor's Degree

1. Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee consisted for the purpose.
2. Any gap of one year or more in the academic career of an applicant just prior to seeking admission to the Bachelor Degree must be supported by documentary evidence or she or he has to give an undertaking as the proof of her or his activities during the period of gap.
3. All the original certificates must be produced by an applicant at the time of verification.
4. Candidate coming from Board/University other than H.P. Board of School Education or H.P. University must provide original Migration certificate at the time of filling of University Registration Form.
5. Physically Disabled Applicants seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificate from Medical Board.
6. National Open School students seeking admission to the 1st year of Bachelor Degree must have cleared all the five papers including English.

7. Admission of a candidate is liable to be cancelled in case she or he furnishes incomplete/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
8. Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. The Principal can deny admission to any such student whose conduct is detrimental to the interest/discipline of the institution.
9. Initially all admissions shall be provisional / and subject to the final approval by University.
10. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the University notification issued from time to time.

Outline of the Courses offered under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) for U.G. Classes

1. **Core Course:** A course offered by a Discipline/Subject which is to be compulsorily studied by the candidate.
 - a. Discipline Specific Core Course (DSC) of Six Credits: A core course offered by the Discipline or Subject chosen by the candidate as main or other Discipline/Subject. These courses aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in a specific discipline.
 - b. Two papers each of English and Hindi in B.A. and B. Com of Six Credits.
2. **Elective Course:** A course which a student can choose from a pool of courses offered by a Discipline/Subject.
 - a. Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSE) of Six Credits: An elective course is a course which is chosen by a student from the courses offered by the Discipline/Subject of her or his choice. These courses are advanced courses which provide an extended scope.
 - b. Generic Elective course (GE) of Six Credits: Any course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/Subject (core or elective of that Discipline/Subject)with an intention to seek exposure.
3. **Ability Enhancement Course**
 - a. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) of Four Credits: These courses include Environmental Science and English/Hindi
 - b. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) of Four Credits: A course which a student studies in DSC-1 (Main Subject). They are value based courses that aim to provide hands-on training to hone the skills and competences.

Choosing Programme/study courses

A candidate seeking admission in B.A. is required to choose one of the subjects listed below as DSC-1 (main subject) which comprises of two papers. Thereafter the student will choose the **other subject (DSC-2)** from the list of subjects as given in the Groups; it will also have two papers.

How to select Subjects in Science Stream?

Step 1: A Student has to select one Main Subject from the above list. The selected subject will have two papers in the first year.

Step 2: Chemistry is essential for all, irrespective of the Main Subject as chosen above. It will also have two papers. Combination of Zoology and Botany is mandatory.

Step 4: Combination of Physics and Mathematics is also mandatory.

Step 5: AECC English & AECC Environment Science is compulsory for all science students.

Guidelines for Admission to M.A. Courses:

The college offers post-graduate courses in the subjects of English, Commerce and Political Science. The number of available seats in every course is as under:

M.Com.	30 seats
M.A. English	20 seats
M.A. Political Science	30 seats

General Rules:

The admission will be on the basis of centralized entrance tests conducted by the University for the session 2025-25. The students interested in admission to the institution, will have to apply separately after the declaration of results by the University. The final list of candidates will be decided on merit.

An applicant should not be more than 26 years of age as on 01-07-2025 in case of boys & 28 years in case of girls. The upper age limit is 29 years for SC/ST applicants. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months for reasons to be recorded in writing.

1. A candidate who fails in First semester may be permitted to join Second semester but she/he shall not be permitted to proceed from First to Third semester without appearing in Second semester examination.
2. 15% and 7.5% reservation is available to SC and ST applicants respectively. In case the reserved seats remain vacant, the same shall be considered open for the general category applicants.
3. The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed only on the production of Migration Certificate and Character Certificate in original from Head of the Institution last attended.

Note: An eligible candidate who has passed Honours course in Commerce / English / Pol. Science will be given weightage as per the University norms.

Eligibility Conditions:

Candidates who have passed Bachelor's Degree examination with at least 50% marks in aggregate or 45% marks or Honours in English/ Economics/ Pol. Science are eligible. Relaxation of 5% marks in minimum eligibility for admission will be given to SC/ST candidates.

Procedure of Admission:

1. The candidate should fill the admission form in her/his own handwriting and submit it to the admission committee. The admission form must be complete in all respects.
2. A candidate seeking admission to first year of any course must appear before the concerned admission committee with her/his parents or guardian.
3. A candidate seeking admission to any class should appear before the concerned admission committee, thereafter the Chief Convener of the Faculty concerned.
4. When admission is granted to a candidate, the candidate must deposit fees within a day failing which her/his admission will stand cancelled.
5. At the time of appearing before the admission committee, the applicant should submit her/his application form complete in all respects with other documents in the sequence given below:
 - (i) Admission Form
 - (ii) Library Registration Form
 - (iii) Character Certificate in original
 - (iv) Attested copies of Matriculation, 10+2 Certificate & attested copy of Bachelor Degree Certificate.
 - (v) Attested copy of H.P.U. Registration Card, if available.

B.Voc. (Bachelor of Vocational Course)

Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) course in Hospitality and Tourism has been started from the session 2021 in the college. The University Grant Commission (UGC) has launched an employment oriented scheme on Skill development based higher education as a part of College/University education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree with multiple entry and exit levels viz Diploma, Advanced Diploma and Degree in compliance to the National Skills Qualification Frameworks (NSQF). NSQF aims at integrating conventional and vocational education systems of education and training. The Indian tourism and hospitality industry has emerged as one of the key drivers of growth among the services sector in India.

Eligibility

The students who have completed 10+2 (HP Board or equivalent) or candidates who have already NSQF certification level 4 in a particular industry sector or candidates who have acquired NSQF certification level 4 but may like to change their trade and enter into skill-based courses in a different trade are eligible to apply for the course.

Internship & Placement:

Students will have to undertake an internship at the end of each academic year for the successful completion of degree course. The internship is an integral and compulsory part of three-year B.Voc. Degree program. Students will be supported by “Vibrant Placement Cell” established by Department of higher education in each college with potential opportunities.

Migration Rules:

1. Inter-institution migration (including from one college to another as well as from a college to the ICDEOL and vice versa) of students will be allowed when no objection is obtained from both the relieving and receiving institution (signed by their respective principals/ directors) to ascertain especially that the Main/Other subjects being studied by the migrating student are available in the receiving institution.
2. The migrated students must bring with him/her.
 - a) Lecture Attendance statement
 - b) Character certificate from the principal of the college last attended.
3. After the migration has been sanctioned and notified by the university the student must join the second college within the given period i.e. by the date given by the university.
4. The first college is entitled to the tuition fee for month in which the university sanctioned the migration.
5. The admission of student migrating from another university or migration during the same course from the officiated shall be governed by the regulations framed by the executive council in this behalf from time to time.

Evaluation Process

Students are assessed through an evaluation system comprising of Comprehensive Continuous Assessment (CCA) and End-Term Examination (ETE).

Comprehensive Continuous Assessment (CCA):30 marks

Mid-TermTest: 10 marks, Class Test: 5 marks, Assignment / Seminar / Presentation: 10 marks

Attendance: 5 marks

End-Term Examination (ETE):70 Marks

For practical subjects, ETE will be split up into ETE Practical (20 marks) and ETE Theory (50 marks).

Class Room Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum75% lectures/tutorials /practical. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Term Examination (ESE).

Provided that those having between74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.

Provide that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a medical Certificate.

Completion of Degree

A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in the college affiliated to the Himachal Pradesh University for a period not less than three and not more than five academic years from the date of admission. For completion of an undergraduate degree the student shall have to accumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of coursework. Successful Passing of a course includes Classroom learning, assignment work, Mid-term test and Annual Examination.

Note: The admission to B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. 1st year will be according to the latest directions from the government. The information regarding the same will be displayed on the notice board of the college, on the website and the same will be disseminated through Print/Electronic Media.

2. Every student must keep the fee receipt safe throughout the session as a proof of payment of college dues.

3. These dues are likely to be charged as per new direction from Govt. / University.

Rules of the Payment of Dues:

1. Notice for depositing fee will be put up on the college notice board.
2. The names of those students will be struck off from the college rolls who fail to clear dues well in time or remain absent for a period of 10 days or more at a stretch.
3. ABSENCE FINES ARE TO BE PAID AT THE TIME OF PAYMENT OF COLLEGE DUES. Other fines are to be paid within the notified period.

The students have to apply online on the National Scholarship Portal and submit the photocopies of the downloaded forms along with photocopies of the required documents for verification to the concerned teacher in charge. The scholarships are awarded to the eligible students as per the rules & norms prescribed by the government and are disbursed online through DBT into the beneficiaries accounts. Hence, it is mandatory for every student to link his/her Bank Account to his/her AADHAR.

Note : If two male wards of the same parent are getting education in the college, only one will be eligible for scholarship / fee concession.

Leave Rules for Students and Fine

1. A student can proceed on leave with prior permission of the Principal. The application should also be signed by the parent of the student and duly recommended by the teacher.
2. A teacher can recommend leave up to maximum of five days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the Principal.
3. Leave on account of illness, if it is for more than three days must be accompanied by medical

Certificate.

4. Students participating in various inter college games or other competitions including youth festival, educational tours etc. will have to get their leave sanctioned by the Principal with prior recommendation of their concerned in charges before their departure.
5. Failure to pay dues on / by due date will entail a fine of Re One (1/-) per day.
6. If a student remains absent without any sanctioned leave for ten days or more, his / her name shall be struck off from the College Rolls.
7. A student can take readmission by paying a fine of Rs. 100/- for the first time and Rs. 200/- for the second time on the recommendation of concerned teacher. No third chance of readmission will be given under any circumstances.

Other fines:

- Absence fine per period: Re. 2/-
 - Absence from practical: Rs. 5/-
 - Absence from Mid-Term Test: Rs. 10/- per Paper
 - Late return of Library books: Re. 1/- per day after 14 days.
8. The Principal can expel / rusticate a student from the College, if found guilty of misconduct.
Note: Leave thus sanctioned by the college administration will not be considered for calculating the attendance. However, no fine will be charged for the period of authorized absence (leave period) from the college.

College Library

The College Library plays a crucial role in teaching and learning activities. Our College Library has already built up a good collection of books and our effort is to collect more reference material to strengthen the teaching and learning requirements of the institute. The Library has regular subscription of Five Newspapers and Eight Magazines.

Library rules.

- ✓ Students of all classes can get books from college library.
- ✓ Failure to return the book/books on the 16th day from the date of the issue will entail a fine of Rs. 1.00 per book per day.
- ✓ A book, after it issued to a student, if gets damaged or is lost, the borrower (student) will be required to pay for the damage or loss.
- ✓ Magazines/Reference books/ Dictionaries/ News Papers/ Periodicals are not issued. However, the students can consult the same in the library.
- ✓ College identity cum library card is invariably to be carried while visiting the library. This card should be kept carefully.

- ✓ Loss of books should immediately be communicated to the librarian in writing.
- ✓ Library is a sacred place. It expects decency and decorum maintained not only by its staff but also by the visitor readers. Therefore college expects its students to observe necessary silence & discipline while they are in the library.

No Dues Certificate and refund of library security

All the issued books must be returned and library card should be surrendered to the librarian before the annual examination. A no dues certificate to this effect should be obtained from the librarian otherwise, Roll No. slip will not be issued. The students can claim refund of their library security within one year of leaving the college, even when they leave without completing their course of study. The security will stand lapsed, if not claimed within the stipulated time.

College Library/Identity Card

Each admitted student will be issued a college Library /Identity card which will have her/his complete personal information along with his/her stamp size photograph. In case of loss of this card, a duplicate identity card will be issued on payment of Rs 20/- after production of the copy of FIR lodged with the concerned police station.

College Magazine

The College has been publishing its magazine *ManuDhara* since the session 2008-09. This magazine provides an opportunity to creatively express the novel & diverse ideas innately residing in the young & vibrant minds. Thus providing a suitable platform to our students to showcase their talent and hone their creative writing skills. All the students can contribute their write-ups for the college magazine through the designated editors of various sections.

Sports and Co-curricular Activities

The college provides facilities to the students who wish to make a mark in games. The college prepares teams for University Championships in Athletics, Basketball, Cricket, Volleyball, Table tennis, Badminton and Kabaddi etc.. The college provides various incentives to the students for participating in various competitions held at University/ State/ Zonal/ National level. The college also provides guidance to students for participation in various competitions held during the University Youth Festivals such as : Music (vocal & instrumental), Debates, Declamation, Quiz, Poetic Symposium, Painting, Dance, Poster Making, Rangoli, Collage etc.

NSS

NSS is a very important part of the activities of any educational institute. It helps in developing the spirit of service of the community. The University has sanctioned the college half unit of NSS with a membership of 50 students. The volunteers have been actively engaged in campus beautification and cleanliness and other services of the community. Enrollment in NSS is done on volunteer basis. NCC aims at developing discipline, character, and brotherhood, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. It also aims to strengthen leadership qualities among the youth who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. It also motivates them to choose a career in armed forces. Living up to its motto, “ Unity and Discipline” , the NCC strives to be and is one of the greatest cohesive forces of the nation, bringing together the youth hailing from different parts of the country and moulding them into united, secular and disciplined citizens of the nation. Educational / Study Tours

Educational / study tours are organized so that the students do not remain within the confines of their curriculum and can extend outside the boundaries of the classroom and academics. The students who are regular and have aboveboard conduct will be eligible for the Educational Tours. Students will have to produce written permission from their parents for joining such tours. No tour can be organized without an accompanying teacher and prior permission of the college Administration. An accompanying female teacher is mandatory in case of girl students going for an educational tour/ tournament/ youth festival.

Boys' Hostel: The College has a Boys' Hostel with the intake capacity of forty inmates. Students desirous of availing hostel accommodation can apply to the hostel warden. Application for admission into the Hostel can be made after a student gets himself/herself admitted into the college. Hostel seats are allotted strictly on the basis of merit of the students by the Hostel Advisory Committee set up for the purpose. A few seats are reserved for SC/ST candidates. Mere admission into the College does not confer any right to Hostel accommodation. The admission into the Hostel and conduct of the boarder is governed by the Hostel rules and regulations.

Conduct & Discipline inside the Hostel:

- (i) Students shall maintain discipline and peaceful atmosphere in hostel;
- (ii) A student may be fined or expelled from the hostel by the principal/Warden/ for the following reasons: -
 - a) Misbehaviour of any kind, which will include disrespectful conduct towards the Principal/ Warden or other teacher, employees of the hostel and other residents;
 - b) Teasing or otherwise harassing other students and/ or the use of violence;
 - c) Stealing or pilfering Hostel/ University property or the property of other students;
 - d) Unruly conduct or rowdism;
 - e) Writing on walls, sticking of posters, distribution of unauthorized handbills or notices;
 - f) Making noise and/ or creating other disturbance including the use of transistor, radio etc. in a manner likely to disturb other boarders;
 - g) Convening, organizing, attending unauthorized meeting within the hostel premises; and
 - h) Breach of any of the hostel rules.
- (iii) No student shall keep gold or costly jewellery in his/her room;
- (iv) While visiting common room/dining hall, the student should be in proper dress;
- (v) For any willful disobedience or defiance or willful tampering with hostel property or insolvent behaviour, the student may asked by the Warden/Hostel Advisory Committee to leave the hostel immediately in anticipation of the approval of the Principal.
- (vi) Students shall use or handle with care all property belonging to the hostel. When a student found guilty of want on damage of hostel property, the warden/ Hostel welfare may recover the cost of repair or replacement and in addition, may impose a fine or recommend imposition of fine depending on the circumstances;
- (vii) In case of any unauthorized guest/ person is found in the rooms of the boarders, his/her room as well as the admission from the concerned department will liable to be cancelled forthwith;
- (viii) All rooms in the hostel shall be opened for inspection by Principal/ Hostel Advisory Committee / Warden at any time during day and night;
- (ix) Students shall not abuse, maltreat or assault hostel employees;
- (x) The dealing of the students with fellow students should be courteous. Quarrels or disputes with fellow students should be avoided. Students shall not under any circumstances, take the law in their own hands.

GENERAL REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT IN THE COLLEGE

JLN Govt. College, Haripur, Manali prides itself on the healthy, congenial and empowering relationship it fosters between all the members of the College Community. The mere observance of rules, though essential, is not enough. A positive, progressive and participatory outlook and an eagerness to benefit from, as well as contribute richly to, the total life of the College are the hallmarks of this small but fast-growing institution. A caring, courteous and magnanimous disposition that transcends all levels of discrimination and exemplifies profound respect to the greatness and nobility of the human spirit is fundamental to the culture of the college. As discipline is the backbone of any educational institution, the college lays special emphasis on the maintenance of discipline and decorum in and outside the classrooms. The students need to keep the following points in mind:-

1. Every student of the college is subject to, and must submit to, the discipline of the college and the university, and abide by the rules and customs of the college.
2. Non-observance of the rules and customs, or breach of college discipline, could result in the termination/expulsion of a student from the roles of the college.
3. All students of the College shall behave courteously with one another, senior members and office staff in the College. A serious view shall be taken of any form of discourtesy.
4. In order to create a favourable academic atmosphere in the college, students should maintain silence while moving in the college campus or sitting in the Library. Movement from one classroom to another should be orderly.
5. Students should regularly carry with them their Identity Cards. They may be required to produce their cards at any time during the college hours.
6. All students must come to the college in neat, clean and decent dress and also give special attention to personal cleanliness and hygiene.
7. Students must pay respect to National Anthem and National Symbols.
8. The following activities will be considered as violative of the college discipline and may result in fine, expulsion or rustication, depending on the gravity of the offence:
 - a) Quarrelling in the campus, indulging in violence, use of force and ragging.
 - b) Shouting, making noise and disturbing classes.
 - c) Breaking/ damaging college property.
 - d) Bringing outsiders in the college campus.
 - e) Writing on/defacing walls and blackboards.
 - f) Putting up a notice, sticking bills etc. on the notice board or at any other place without the permission of the Principal.
 - g) Eve-teasing
 - h) Crowding in corridors and staircases and blocking passages.
 - i) Any student using Alcohol, Tobacco, Gutkha and other narcotics in the college campus will be fined up to Rs. 5000/- and is liable for expulsion or resuscitation from the college.
 - j) Only those functions will be allowed to be held in the college which are organised by college or have been permitted by the college authorities with prior permission from the concerned authorities. Failing which, would be treated as a case of breach of discipline.
 - k) No tours/parties will be organised without proper authorisation from the principal.
 - l) Unnecessary use of mobile phones or playing music on mobile phones in the campus.

9. A student who is found guilty of misconduct shall not be eligible for any scholarship, prize, fee concession or membership of the CSCA or any other important bodies in the college.

10. RAGGING IN ANY FORM IS A HEINOUS CRIME AND PUNISHABLE OFFENCE. IT IS STRICTLY BANNED IN THE COLLEGE. IT IS MANDATORY TO FILE AN F.I.R. IN CASE OF RAGGING.

11. Use of intoxicants, drugs or alcohol is totally prohibited in the college premises.
12. Students will be held responsible for any damage caused by them to the furniture, fixtures or buildings. They shall compensate the college for the damage caused and shall also have to pay the punitive fine as well.

Anti Smoking /Anti Tobacco

Smoking and use of tobacco products are strictly prohibited in the college campus. Anyone found smoking or using tobacco products will have to pay a fine of Rs. 5000/- in addition to suspension or expulsion from the college.

RAGGING (ZERO TOLERANCE)

Ragging is strictly banned as per orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court and the directions issued by higher authorities. Ragging includes any type of physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual or group, either by words or by conduct, which creates an apprehension in the mind of the person that he/ she cannot pursue his/her studies free from any mental disturbance or torture created thereby. Any person who aids or abets such an action shall also be guilty of such ragging.

Ragging in and around the college /hotel campus or on road approaches leading thereto is strictly prohibited. If any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged to expel the guilty students from the college/hostel. On a written complaint from the newcomers, those found indulging in ragging will be handed over to the police.

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence the possible punishment for those found guilty of ragging shall be any one or any combination of the following:

1. Withholding scholarship or other benefit.
2. Debarring from representation of college events.
3. Withholding of results.
4. Suspension or expulsion from hostel, mess and college.
5. Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated.
6. Fine upto Rs. 25000/- with public apology.
7. In case of more serious allegations, FIR will be lodged with police and matter will be disposed of in the court of law where if convicted for such an offence the offender can be punished with institution and will not be eligible for admission in any other institute for a period of three years.
